Haiti's population of nearly 11 Million people remain extremely vulnerable to natural hazards with Haiti ranked 15th globally for risk of humanitarian crises and disasters (Inform risk 6.5) and approximately 96% percent of the population is at risk of at least two hazards. There remain many structural challenges which further exacerbates this risk and weakens resilience against future shocks and stresses. The 2018 Haiti humanitarian response plan estimated that 2.8 million people would be in need of humanitarian assistance in 2018, with US\$252.2 million required to target 2.2 million people. Priority areas for humanitarian action in 2018 were;

- Provide immediate assistance to 1.3 million people living in severe food insecurity
- Reduce mortality and morbidity from epidemics, particularly cholera and other water-borne diseases
- Reinforce protection for returnees from Dominican Republic and people still displaced
- Respond to unmet needs for 1 million people still in need from recent hurricanes (Matthew in 2016, Irma and Maria in 2017)
- Support the reinforcement of national disaster preparedness and response capacity
- Strengthen the humanitarian-development nexus

UNFPA works closely with governments, UN agencies and other partners to ensure that the needs of women, girls and young people are addressed throughout humanitarian preparedness and response through providing sexual and reproductive health (SRH) information and life-saving services such as antenatal care, safe delivery and post-partum care, re-establishing access to safe and effective family planning and prevention, mitigation and response to gender-based violence (GBV). Of the US\$2.7M requested by UNFPA for humanitarian response in 2018, \$637K was mobilized for preparedness (\$129K) and response (\$497K) post Matthew (23 per cent). In 2018 UNFPA;

- Reached over 32,097 Haitian women of reproductive age (15-49 years) affected by Hurricane Matthew and/or displaced in Grande Anse, South and West Departments.
- Strengthened preparedness for the 2018 Atlantic Hurricane Season
- Responded to the 5.9 magnitude earthquake that occurred 20km north of Port-de-Paix (North West) on 6 October that killed 18 and injured 548 people and affected 31,500 families (around 157,000 people) across the North West, North and Artibonite Departments – UNFPA and partners distributed 1,266 dignity kits, 578 cooking kits and 548 solar lamps, and reached 2,947 people through 12 mobile SRH clinics for the North-West earthquake response
- Completed capacity building workshops on humanitarian response for 58 UNFPA staff and partner's 19 and 23 February
- Trained 51 professionals were trained on Minimum Initial Service Package for Reproductive health / Clinical management of rape in 5 Departments completing a network of 151 professionals throughout all 10 Departments
- Had 58 partners from the central and departmental levels of key Government Ministries, civil society, INGO and UN agencies participate in the contingency planning workshop for SRH and GBV on 31 July and 1 August 2018.
